REPORT

Fashion design is the art of applying design, aesthetics, clothing construction and natural beauty to clothing and its accessories. It is influenced by culture and different trends and has varied over time and place. "A fashion designer creates clothing, including dresses, suits, pants, and skirts, and accessories like shoes and handbags, for consumers. He or she can specialize in clothing, accessory, or jewelry design, or may work in more than one of these areas according to their interests.

The course on "FASHION DESIGNING" had offered to the undergraduates of IIndFamily and Community Science to develop their skills in fashion designing. The course was coordinated by Dr Anooja Thomas, Associate Professor Dept. Of Family and Community Science. The course started on the 1st of August 2017 and the course was handled by external FD experts Ms. Chithra who handled practical classes and Ms. Athira who was in charge of the theory classes.

Expected course outcome of the theory course:

- Design garments for different figure types. Visualize and Apply the basic procedure in garment construction

- Explain the fundamentals of fashion designing

- Repairor recycleold garments by adding decorative and design elements and createnews tyles




