Action Taken:

1) Administrative Audit.

2) Department wise Accreditation.

Member Secretary reported that, the DSAR for the last 5 years has been prepared and submitted by all departments. A three member team has also been identified for evaluation. The dates will be decided after the evaluators give consent for their visit.

3) B.Voc programs

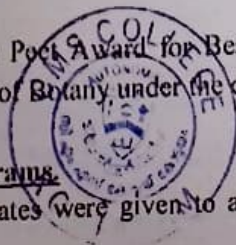

c) Community College


Member secretary reported that, starting of a community college is on anvil. It is decided to include stitching courses making use of facilities of the loassery weaving school.
