

##### Constitution of Examination standing committee.

Member Secretary reported that, since the result declaration is not in the purview of Governing Council as per UGC Regulations 2018, it is necessary to form a Standing Committee including Management representatives, Principal, COE, Faculties and external members. This can reduce the delay in declaration of examination results. After discussion, the council entrusted Principal and COE to study the matter in detail and to submit a proposal in the next meeting.

#### Other matters.

##### ➤ Approval of Examination schedule.

Member Secretary presented the Examination Schedule for the academic year 2019 – 2020. It was reported that, more focus has been given to centralized valuation of both UG and PG programs. After discussion, the council approved the Examination schedule.

##### ➤ PG online examination – Negative marks.

Principal reported about the apprehension of teachers regarding the possibility of affecting the marks scored by the students in the descriptive examination, if there is negative marking in the online examination. After discussion, it was decided to include multiple choice questions in the online exam as in the case of UGC exam without negative marks.

##### ➤ Convocation

It is decided to conduct the convocation of both UG and PG students in the first week of September 2019.

##### ➤ Annual report of e-governance

The annual report of the e-governance for the academic year 2018-2019 is submitted before the Governing Council for approval.





➤ Bicentenary Valedictory function.

Member Secretary reported that, the Bicentenary Valedictory function of CMS College Kottayam is scheduled to be conducted on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2019 at 9 am in the Great Hall. Arch Bishop of Canterbury The Most Rev. Justin Welbi will be the chief guest for the function.

➤ Extension activity.

Member Secretary briefed about the village extension activities undertaken by the College during the time of flood. It was reported that a proposal has been submitted to The Federal Bank for their association with our College's village extension activities and service learning initiatives. The role of social worker is inevitable to coordinate the activities. As part of preliminary discussion with Federal Bank, they expressed willingness to contribute the salary of social worker as part of their CSR activities.

➤ Vehicle.

Member Secretary reported about the importance of College Bus for students transportation and extension activities.

After discussion, the council entrusted Principal to initiate action in this regard.
