Reporting of the current projects:

- The high-tension power project of around Rs 70 lakhs is completed with the approval waiting from the KSEB.
- The library is getting revamped into a world-class, digitized library for enhancing research, teaching and learning.
- The newly built aquarium project constructed serves as an attractive and appealing destination.
- The ornamental fish breeding project is in progress.



- The sculpture garden and relief sculpture unify campus aesthetics and value aligning them with the history of the College and the Church. Thirty sculptors worked on the 5000-square feet campus wall to complete the project.
- Under the green campus initiative, this year's focus was on water management, waste management, dry leaf compost, and enhancement towards an environment-friendly campus. A fully automated irrigation system is incorporated. Additionally, a new pump house is built to ensure adequate upkeep.
- Six solar projects are suggested to be implemented in carefully planned phases as a step toward sustainability. The PTA fund is used to complete the first two of the six projects.
- The construction of the Canteen is ongoing and it will get completed in forty days' time.
- Regarding the NAAC, IQA, and SSR, work is ongoing.

#### Other Matters:

The Chairman, Rt. Rev. Dr. Malayil Sabu Koshy Cherian and Prof Soma Bandopadhyay appreciated the Principal, the teaching and non-teaching personnel for the well conduction of the Graduation Ceremony on 28<sup>th</sup> October (for all graduates of 2020 and 2021) and 29<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 (for graduates of 2022).


The Principal reported that the B. Sc. Computer Science and M.Sc. Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics curricula have been already submitted to the MG University and the approval is pending.

No other matters rose from the floor.
